You are responsible for completing your Spelling homework Monday through Thursday evenings. Please choose one activity each night from the appropriate column. Make sure you date and label each assignment and bring it to school the following day (or have a parent/guardian signature).

<p><u>Rainbow Words</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words with crayons, markers, or colored pencils. Write each letter of the word in a different color.</p>	<p><u>Sentences</u></p> <p>Write a sentence using each word. Circle the spelling word.</p> <p>Extra: Underline the Complete Subject once & Complete Predicate twice.</p>	<p><u>Secret Agent Words</u></p> <p>Number the alphabet 1-26, then convert your words to a number code.</p>	<p><u>X Words</u></p> <p>Write two words that have one common letter so they crisscross, forming an X.</p>
<p><u>ABC Order</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words in ABC order.</p>	<p><u>Spelling Trees</u></p> <p>Example: 1. Your Y Yo You your</p>	<p><u>What's the Value?</u></p> <p>Write your words and then record the value of each word. Vowels are worth 10 points and consonants are worth 5 points. Ex: cat 5 + 10 + 5 = 20</p>	<p><u>Story Words</u></p> <p>Write a short story using all of your spelling words. Underline each word in the story.</p>
<p><u>Fancy Writing</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words in fancy letters or decorate your letters.</p>	<p><u>Words without Vowels</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words replacing the vowels with stars.</p>	<p><u>Picture</u></p> <p>Draw a picture of each of your words. Your picture should help you understand what the word is/means.</p>	<p><u>Synonym/Antonym</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words. Next to each word, write one synonym and one antonym.</p>
<p><u>Ransom Words</u></p> <p>Write your words by cutting out letters from a magazine or newspaper and glue them onto your paper.</p>	<p><u>Rhyme Time</u></p> <p>Write each word. Next to each word write 2-3 words that rhyme.</p>	<p><u>Syllable Words</u></p> <p>Divide each spelling word into its syllable parts.</p>	<p><u>Classified</u></p> <p>Classify each of your spelling words according to parts of speech {noun, adjective, verb, adverb, etc.}</p>
